Universal Tools	Large and small scissors.These need to be sharp.Seam ripper.Pins (preferably longwith a large head)Thread, a few spools of neutral colors.Measuring tape,preferably a sewing one, but a smallretractable one works as well.Chalk orfabric marking pencil.Iron and Ironing board
Hand Sewing	Hand sewing needles, Buttons and sew-on snaps Thimble Small embroidery scissors
Fabrics	Most fabrics work, I personally like to keep a variety of light and heavy fabrics. Denim, flannel, quilting weight cotton, bamboo, hemp,muslin and linen. These could be new or thrifted. You just want to store clean and folded, in a tote or sealed bag. Having about a yard of these will provide a lot of options for mending and new projects.
Machine sewing	If you do not already have a sewing machine, look for a very simple model. The older Singer, Brother, Pfaff, Bernina, or Janome are good options. Three features you want are, straight stitch, zigzag, and reverse. You will also need: The correct bobbins for the lower thread on the machine, Sewing Machine needles (most machines can use the universal size)

Extras	In your preps you may like to have some extra supplies like:
	Elastic, Velcro, Snaps, spray adhesive, leather\upholstery repair needles, bottoms, zippers in various weight and lengths like separating sport zippers for coats, belting and buckles or hooks. Grommets and the tools to set them. Cording, Bias tape, Ribbon, embroidery thread, cotton yarn, and fusable interfacing. Batting and PUL (used for waterproofing) are also options. Optional tools are also: Cutting mat, rotary cutter, clear quilting ruler, Quilting or an embroidery hoop. Pattern weights Pattern paper
То	Machine oil, soft brush, small screw driver, compressed air(for dusting out lint)
Maintain	extra light bulbs that fit your machine.
